

Along the Way: North Attleboro senior speaks at State House

Meagan Lee, a senior at North Attleboro High School, spoke at the Statehouse on Wednesday about the importance of civic education. Lee joined a panel of students, teachers, and lawmakers, including state Sen. Becca Rausch, D-Needham, to discuss the topic. "I believe that civic education's value is far more than completing a course or project, it is to shape the road of our future changemakers," Lee said. The event was part of Massachusetts Civics Learning Week. The speakers reflected on the years since the 2017 implementation of new teaching standards in the Commonwealth and the 2018 passage of the Civic Education Law. They also talked about the need to maintain the Civics Project Trust Fund and the \$2.5 million investment in civics education. Lee is a student representative on the North Attleboro School Committee and is running for a seat on the committee in the April 2 town election.
